FACT SHEET

10 SIGNS OF CANCER IN SMALL ANIMALS

- abnormal swellings that persist and continue to grow
- sores that do not heal
- weight loss
- loss of appetite
- bleeding or discharge from any body opening
- offensive odour
- difficulty eating or swallowing
- hesitation to exercise or loss of stamina
- persistent lameness or stiffness
- difficulty breathing, urinating or defecating.

These signs do not necessarily indicate cancer but they should be investigated by your local Veterinarian as soon as possible. Just as in people, early detection of cancer in pets can mean a much better outcome from treatment.
